

# LEARNING to LIVE the L.I.F.E.

Learning to live the LIFE in **Sunday School** means learning to **live like Jesus**.

**L.I.F.E.** is an acronym that outlines four components that help change us from the inside out.

The small-group, interactive ministry of Sunday School allows all members to learn God's Word at their own level of understanding with others who share similar interests, abilities, needs, and experiences.

Sunday School provides the Bible knowledge and the age-level practice for telling others about Jesus. Students can leave Sunday School ready to share God's Word both by telling how God is changing their own lives and by living a life that draws attention to Jesus.

According to Ephesians 4, teachers help prepare God's people for works of service. In Sunday School, students can learn to minister to one another. Students can also plan ways to help others. Periodically the entire Sunday School can participate in a national ministry project that helps thousands of others in Jesus' name.
